Most of the excessive heat warnings and heat advisories have been cancelled across the state. Only Racine and Kenosha counties have heat advisories issued until 7:00 p.m. tonight. There is a chance of scattered storms this evening.

Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) has received a report of one confirmed heat related death in Columbia County. The individual was over 65 year of age.

Several cooling centers remain open. A listing of reported cooling centers is located on the WI Emergency Management website <http://emergencymanagement.wi.gov> and the ReadyWisconsin website at <http://readywisconsin.wi.gov>. With the cooler weather, residents should contact the center to ensure it is open.

Portage County- Damage assessments were conducted yesterday following the severe storms and straight line winds that hit the Stevens Point area earlier this week. Nine homes sustained major damage. Approximately 400 customers are still without power.

There has been no request for state assistance. Wisconsin Emergency Management continues to monitor the situation for heat related issues and other events.
