Clean up continues from Friday and Saturday storms. There has been no report of damage from last night's storms. The National Weather Service says there is a chance for scattered showers today but they are not expected to be severe.

Most of the power across the state has been restored. WE Energies reported that as of noon today they had roughly 5,500 customers in the Fox Valley without power. They anticipate power should be restored by tonight or tomorrow morning. Since Friday morning, WE Energies has restored power to more than 35,000 customers.

Here is the current update:

Outagamie County: Approximately 215 homes and businesses sustained minor damage and 12 reported major damage as a result of Friday's storms. Early damage estimates to be \$2.6 million which includes \$900,000 to a roof of a building owned by Foremost Dairy. This estimate does not include major damage sustained by Wisconsin Builder's Supply or the financial and inventory loss to businesses impacted by the power outages. Additional assessments will continue on Tuesday. The Outagamie Emergency Operation Center (EOC) is now closed but county emergency management continues to monitor the situation. The City of Appleton EOC is expected to close later today. Local fire departments checked area schools this morning to ensure there were no hazards or other issues.

Waushara County: All county roads are now open. Yesterday, the Red Cross provided meals at three locations for residents without power. Approximately 30 people attended.

Wisconsin Emergency Management continues to monitor the situation. At this time, there have been no requests for state assistance.
