Storm Update 10 / September 30, 2016 / 4 p.m.

Overview- The National Weather Services (NWS) is forecasting light rain showers across the state through Saturday. Forecasters expect rain totals of less than half an inch of rain.

County assessment teams continue surveying damage to public infrastructure (roads, bridges, etc.) and submitting to Wisconsin Emergency Management preliminary cost estimates to repair that damage. In addition, homeowners and businesses that sustained damage should report to county emergency management offices. Here is the latest update as of 4:00 pm:
