Inject:	<p>The State Veterinarian calls the County Emergency Manager to alert her/him to the situation and ask for local assistance.</p> <p>“There is one animal at the county fairgrounds with signs of a foreign animal disease. It was initially identified by the fair veterinarian. A Foreign Animal Disease Diagnostician has also examined the animal. She collected some samples that are currently on their way to the lab. We should have results of the initial tests within 24 hours. The presence of a foreign animal disease has not been confirmed, but we are taking these steps as a precautionary measure. We do several of these types of investigations each year. Based on what the state district veterinarian saw, the Federal Area Veterinarian in Charge and I believe it would be best if we initiate some preventive measures in case it does prove to be a foreign animal disease. Such a disease could have a huge impact on the state of Iowa and for that matter the entire United States.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> All animals are to be quarantined and remain on the fair ground premises. That means all animals that are currently there (livestock, pets, birds, everything). Please get some of your law enforcement people over there as soon as possible to enforce this. Road blocks should be set up on a 6.2 mile radius around the fairgrounds to create an Infected Zone, Control Area to prevent animals moving into or out of the area. For now all livestock and hoofed wild animals (do you have any elk farms around there?) may not move into or out of that 6.2 mile radius circle. That would mean cattle, horses, sheep, goats, etc. At this point those animals can’t leave for any reason (including veterinary care). Vehicles and equipment are not allowed to leave the fairgrounds until they have been cleaned and disinfected. All individuals at the fair grounds must be disinfected before they can leave. Everyone should at least wash their hands and go through a footbath with appropriate contact time. Those who have had contact with the pigs should probably have a shower and transfer into clean clothes. Everyone should be advised to not have contact with livestock / hoofed wild animals for at least 3 days. Their clothes should all be laundered prior to contacting animals. Inform the public that those who have been at the fair to shower / change clothes before having contact with livestock. I would recommend that you use Virkon-S® as the disinfectant. People may stay at the fairgrounds to care for their animals. The minimal number of people needed to provide care is allowed to remain on the premises. All others should leave. Once people have left the fairgrounds only authorized personnel may enter. Plan on maintaining this status for at least the next 24-48 hours, perhaps longer. Authority for animal quarantine from IDALS IA Code 163.1(1). 			
Expected Actions:	Ensure all know who incident commander at fairgrounds is. Ensure access control plan addresses non-road exits as well.

Inject:	<p>We have results back from Plum Island and the pig tested positive for Foot and Mouth Disease. We will have a euthanasia team there within the next couple of hours. This team should be self-sufficient. We would like to get the animals at the fair grounds in the ground as soon as possible. The DNR has located a burial site for the animals that is a few miles from the fair grounds. We are going to need equipment to assist in moving the dead animals from the fair grounds to the burial site. We will also need some equipment at the burial site to dig the needed trenches. Right now we estimate we will need several dump trucks and a couple of front end loaders at the fair grounds for transporting the animals. We will also need some digging equipment (track-hoe(s), dozers, end loaders) at the burial site. We will need a couple of trenches that total about 500 cubic yards and are six to ten feet deep. The trucks used for transport need to be water tight so body fluids don't leak out during transport. The trucks will also need to be covered during transport.</p>
